AD Required:

Seed – “The seeds are free from UROCYSTIS CEPULAE and DITYLENCHUS DIPSACI.”

Vegetables – “The shipment is free from MYCOSPHAERELLA SCHOENOPRASI and DITYLENCHUS DIPSACI.”

Note: *M. schoenoprasii* is Allium leaf tip dieback and *U. cepulae* is onion smut – They are not known to occur in Kern County. *Ditylenchus dipsaci* is Bulb & Stem Nematode – It has been known to occur in Kern County.
