SUMMARY INFO -

Federal Phytosanitary Certificate Required. Must be free from soil.

AD Required:

“During the last growing season in the country of cultivation the plants have been under official phytosanitary control for at least 1 month prior to the transport to Iceland. Wart disease (SYNCHYTRIUM ENDOBIOTICUM) and Potato cyst nematode (GLOBODERA PALLIDA) are not known to occur in the United States. Golden nematode (GLOBODERA ROSTOCHIENSIS) does not occur and has never been found at the place of cultivation. Colorado potato beetle (LEPTINOTARZIA DECEMLINEATA) does not occur at the place of cultivation and that the place of cultivation is situated in an area where the beetle does not occur.”

Please note that the above pests are not known to occur in the United States, and Kern County does not have Colorado potato beetle.
