Plants in soil are prohibited. Compost, soil, humus, manure are prohibited.

SUBSIDIARY INFO -

Phytosanitary Inspections must take place within 14 days of shipping.
Certificates must be accurate and legible and have no alterations or erasures.

BOTANICAL NAME – *Vitis vinifera*.

PRODUCT FORM – Fruit

RESTRICTIONS – Restricted

SUMMARY INFO – (from CA)

Federal Phytosanitary Certificate required. *Must be free from *Bactrocera curcurbitae* (melon fruit fly), *Bactrocera dorsalis* (Oriental fruit fly), and *Ceratitidis capitata* (Mediterranean fruit fly).

AD Required:

“The fruit originated from an area free from CERATITIS CAPITATA, BACTROCERA CURCURBITAE, and BACTROCERA DORSALIS.”

AND (WRITE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING AD’S):

“The fruit has been grown in a commercial orchard which is situated at least 80 km from any location where CERATITIS CAPITATA, BACTROCERA DORSALIS, or BACTROCERA CURCURBITAE has been known to occur within the last twelve months.”

OR

“The fruit has been treated with an appropriate treatment against fruit flies.”

(If a treatment is done, must be witnessed by an inspector and details must be written in the treatment section of the phyto).

SUBSIDIARY INFO –

Phyto inspections must take place within 14 days of shipment. Certificates must be accurate and legible and have no alterations or erasures.
